What exactly is an AIBO, and why do people love them so much?

An AIBO is a robot dog, about 28 centimetres long and it can do lots of amazing things. For example, it can walk, run, play with a ball, be happy or sad – just like a real dog! It can also dance, sing songs, see colours and take photographs like a camera!



A new (or 'baby') AIBO can't see or hear, but it can understand about 40 words and phrases like *How old are*

you?, Good boy and Don't do that. Say its name and it answers you, say Goodnight and it goes to sleep. When it becomes older, the AIBO learns more words and soon it can talk to you, too. And when it's an 'adult' it can check your emails and read them to you!

These robot pets are very popular in Japan and the USA, but they aren't cheap. Each AIBO is about \$7,500 – so maybe a real dog is better!





The Kennedys

ohn F Kennedy is probably the most famous President in American history, but the story of the Kennedy family is not a happy one. John was born in Boston, USA in 1917.

The Kennedys were a big family and John had five sisters and three brothers. His father, Joseph Kennedy, was a businessman and his



mother Rose was the daughter of a politician.

After university, John worked as a journalist, then became a politician in 1946. But this was an unhappy time for the Kennedy family - John's brother, Joe died in the Second World War and four years later, his sister, Kathleen died in a plane crash.

John became a Senator* in 1952, the same year he met his wife, Jacqueline Bouvier. They got married in 1953 and had three children - but their third child, Patrick, died two days after he was born.

In 1961, John F Kennedy became President, and he was very popular with the American people. He died in Dallas, Texas in November 1963 and his brother Bobby also died five years later.

The Kennedys are a famous family, but their story is a very sad one.



The only way to travel

In 1865, a Belgian man, Georges Nagelmackers, had an idea. He wanted to build a train to travel across Europe and into Asia. Nagelmackers saw Pullman's sleeper cars on the trains in America. Passengers slept on the journey and it was comfortable. Nagelmackers decided to design a train with sleeper cars for Europe. He wanted his train to be fantastic – like a really good hotel inside.

On 4th October, 1883, his train departed from the train station the *Gare de Strasbourg* in Paris. It was called *The Orient Express*. Everybody wanted to travel on *The Orient Express*. Famous passengers were King Ferdinand of Bulgaria, King Leopold the 3rd of Belgium and Czar Nicholas the 2nd of Russia. There were also lots of journalists on the train.

The journey went from Paris in France to Istanbul in Turkey, and it took four days. The first passengers enjoyed the journey so much that everyone wanted to travel on *The Orient Express*.
